## Speaker Biography

Steven W. Teppler is an attorney, inventor, and the CEO of TimeCertain, LLC, an information security solutions company. He founded TimeCertain in 1999 after having confronted first-hand the evidentiary issues presented by challenge-prone digital data content. Mr. Teppler, who has practiced law since 1980, is admitted to the bars of New York, the District of Columbia and Florida, and is a litigator, a member of the Information Security Committee of the American Bar Association, a co-author of the ANSI X9F4 trusted timestamp guideline standards for the financial industry, and a founding member of the Information Assurance Consortium. Mr. Teppler writes about and lectures to the legal, auditing and information security communities about evolving theories of legal liability and the 21st century definition of audit in an electronic data universe. He also advises private and public sector clients about risk, liability, and compliance issues unique to electronic data generation, alteration, transmission and archiving. Mr. Teppler's recent publications include: Life After Sarbanes-Oxley \* The Merger of Information Security and Accountability (co-author) 45 Jurimetrics J. 379 (2005); Digital Signatures Are Not Enough (co-author); Information Systems Security Association, January 2006; State of Connecticut v. Swinton: A Discussion of the Basics of Digital Evidence Admissibility (co-author), Georgia Bar Newsletter Technology Law Section, Spring 2005; The Digital Signature Paradox (co-author), IETF Information Workshop (The West Point Workshop) June 2005; Observations on Electronic Service of Process in the South Carolina Court System, eFiling Report, June 2005. Mr. Teppler received his Bachelor of Arts in Political Science Summa Cum Laude from the City College of New York, Phi Beta Kappa, and received his Juris Doctor from the Benjamin N. Cardozo School of Law in New York City.

## Topic Details

With the recent revelations of options backdating (accomplished by computer and involving 200 companies, billions of dollars lost and now five criminal indictments) digital data content authentication has taken on a new and important role in the corporate compliance world. For those in the information security arena, it means deploying new technology to address emerging compliance challenges, and developing and adhering to robust policies built around these deployments. Because the options backdating fiasco involved (and involves) time-based data manipulation, both technology and policies addressing the removal of that potential must be added to and work in tandem with other information security objectives. Discussed will be the nature of and illustrations of time-based data manipulation, why it has gone "undetected" for so long, what technologies exist to address this problem, a discussion of the emergence of the ANSI X9F4 9.95 trusted timestamp standard for the financial industry, and how that standard can be modeled as a template to provide a key info-sec and compliance component for the enterprise.
